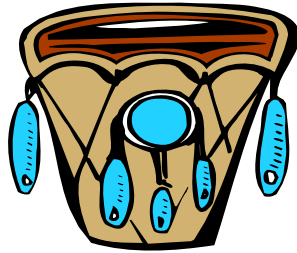

All Webelos wanted for Survivor Island!

Come and see if you got what it takes. Walk through Lava, take the Fire challenge, escape the Walk of Doom, defy the Obstacle Course, test your knot tying skills, use your whittling skills, survive the Water Balloon Toss, and test your Archery and BB skills.

General Information Registration

To register for Survivor Island, complete the attached application on page 4 and return it to the Georgia-Carolina Council, 1804 Gordon Highway, Augusta, GA 30904, or fax to 706-733-0765.

Late registration is accepted on-site at the Knox Scout Reservation Administration Building during check-in.

The leaders must have a medical form for each Scout and parent. (A class 1 medical form is sufficient). You will be asked to present them at registration. Please bring them in a folder labeled with your pack number and the Leader in charge name on the outside of folder. They will be returned to you at check out on the following day.

Camping and Parking

All cars will be parked in designated parking lots. Due to limited parking space carpooling is encouraged. Please see Check-in and registration guidelines page. **NO RIDERS ARE ALLOWED IN THE BED OF TRUCKS OR TRAILERS.**

Camping will be by pack and in an assigned campsite. However due to the size and participation of this event, it may be necessary to combine packs within a campsite area. Please refrain from roping off your campsite area. The only exception would be a Pack's saw yard if they choose to have one. Please **DO NOT** bring an axe, hatchet or chain saw to this event.

Tent camping only, no campers or R.V.'s will be allowed in the campsites. Each unit is responsible for their own meals and equipment. Please be sure to bring containers for water.

Use of gas stoves and charcoal should follow BSA policies and guidelines. BSA Policies can be found at www.scouting.org. Use the site map to search for "Guide to Safe Scouting". Restrooms and shower facilities are available.

Boom boxes, two-way radios, guns, fireworks, sheath knives, **PETS**, and alcoholic beverages are not allowed. All BSA and Georgia-Carolina Council campground policies must be followed.

Make sure all campfires are out before retiring for the night and before you check out. A fire check will be made and you will be awakened to extinguish the fire if no one is tending it.

Be prepared for the weather. Nights can get cold and rain is popular this time of the year. Pack accordingly.
Event will run rain or shine!

BE SURE TO CARRY OUT YOUR OWN TRASH. (YOU CAN DISPOSE OF IT AT THE CAMP DESIGNATED TRASH DUMPSTER AS YOU LEAVE.)

Registration/Check-in

1. Arrive at Knox Scout Reservation Administration parking lot.
2. Send one adult leader to the Registration/check-in area with all medical forms and the attached camp roster. (Note: *Packs that have Pre-Registered will be given express service.*)
3. Combine all Pack equipment & Personal Gear into one or two vehicles if possible. (All vehicles must be parked in the main Parking Lot.)
4. Move one vehicle into your campsite area and unload it immediately and then return it to the parking lot. A second load may be taken at this time. After all equipment has been dropped off please return drop off passes to the Check-in window.
5. Setup campsite (Note: Please be courteous to your neighbors and don't spread out to much; leave room for others.)
6. Please follow the direction of all Staff & Traffic Coordinators. This will facilitate your getting checked in and to your campsite.
7. Information and any changes to the schedule will be given at Check-in.

Program Information

As a survivor, you will be part of a clan, not unlike being a new Boy Scout in a new patrol. A clan/patrol will be determined by the number of participants. So it is possible that more than one pack will make up a patrol. Your clan/patrol is expected to develop a clan/patrol name with a clan/patrol yell and a clan/patrol flag during clan/patrol time on Friday night. Boy Scouting is built upon the patrol method as tasks and responsibilities are divided among members. Each member performs an assignment and as he does so the group survives/succeeds. Each member rotates through leadership positions so that all learn the lessons of cooperation, teamwork and coordination. This is accomplished by the help of the Tribal Leaders/Scoutmasters by allowing each of the patrol members to be in charge of the clan/patrol flag, and other leadership duties (denner/patrol leader, in charge of cleanup, assisting in cooking etc.) during the course of the weekend.

Each clan/patrol will receive material, glue, feathers, markers or paint and string for a clan/patrol flag. The more natural elements (wood, seeds, bark, vines, etc. that are native to Knox Scout Reservation), the higher the score. Flags must be completed by 8:00am on Saturday morning.

Clan/Patrol yell will be scored on originality. (Remember keep it clean)

Clan/Patrol name must be turned into the Survivor Tribal Council (Camp Director Karen Breedlove in the Administration building) by 9:30pm on Friday Night for approval.

Trading Post Information: Hamburgers and Hotdogs, snacks, drinks, and other items will be on sale Friday from 4:30 to 9:00pm and at breakfast, lunch and before and after the campfire on Saturday. Sunday from 8:00 to 9:00am and from 9:45am to 12pm.
